The End of the Bible as we know It.

The Revelation to John, known to most as simply the book of Revelation, is the most mysterious book in Scripture. As the last book of the Bible, Revelation contains some of the most cryptic and exotic language I've ever read anywhere, let alone in Scripture.

For as mysterious as Revelation is, I also think it is one of the most misunderstood books. There are countless misconceptions and mysteries surrounding it, let alone some of the confusion secular (fictional) literature has caused. So what are we to do with Revelation? Here at First Church, we believe in the power of questions and wrestling with things we don't understand. So when it came up this spring in the Revised Common Lectionary (suggested scripture readings for public worship in Christian traditions) I thought... why skip it for something also, when we could use this as an opportunity to study Povolation.

thing else, when we could use this as an opportunity to study Revelation together?!

Starting on May 8, we're going to read parts of The Revelation to John together during worship as a part of our 4-week sermon series, "The End of the Bible as we know it." (Yes, I fully intended for that to be a reference to the well-known REM song... do you feel fine?)

This series will serve as an overview of this often misunderstood book that talks about the end of the world, but not in a literal way many of us may have thought. Our hope in spending time with Revelation over these few short weeks is not to answer all of the questions this book brings with it. Instead, you are invited to take a risk as together we step into the great unknown of what the visionary experience of John as revealed in Revelation has to offer us.

After we have finished this overview in our 4-week series through the month of May, we will kick off June with a summer Bible Study on – you guessed it – the book of Revelation! Join Pastor Jen and Sandee Cole as they kick off this summer study (day and time to be announced). Our hope is that during our sermon series in May, you will begin reading along through this complicated book and take note of questions you might have, so that we might use these questions as a launching place for our study together this summer.

It's going to be a great summer of learning and encountering God, and we can't wait to see you soon – for our worship series, our study, or both.



LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING • APRIL 12, 2022

MEMBERS PRESENT: Barb Brinkman, Chad Miller, Debbie Engels, Doug Wishard, Lea Ann Alwin, Lee Rycraft, Mike Grann, Ronda Boughton, Sarah Caron, Sue Luken, Pastor Jen, Pastor Abigail. ABSENT: Corrine Dahl Welcome prayer by Pastor Jen; devotions by Sue Luken

AGENDA:

COVID UPDATE: All ropes have been removed that were for physical distancing. Children are coming up for Time for Young Disciples. Communion is being served in the front with the option to kneel at the communion rail. Offering remains in the back.

CHURCH DIRECTORY: 78 individuals/families were photographed in March. There will be another photo session May 10-14. All who are on the church list as members or affiliated with the church were called to encourage scheduling a photo appointment. Work will begin in the near future to prepare directory pages for small groups and church activities.

MEMBERSHIP AUDIT: When called for the church directory, some responded that they are no longer members or attending First Church. Leadership Team agreed it is OK to remove those names from our membership roll; a letter will go out to those removed.

COACHING CALL FOLLOW-UP: We need to be more intentional about greeting others at services, especially visitors.

VALUES WORKSHOP FOLLOW-UP: A second Values Workshop was held on March 26th with 37 in attendance. The discussion showed that those in attendance have similar values. It was felt that we don't always have to agree, but we do want to be in community. It was suggested to have spot promos of projects and the various grow groups. It was also suggested to make Leadership team more known and to schedule Leadership Team updates during worship services at least quarterly. The 5 values that were developed at the first Values Workshop will be posted and kept visible.

EASTER EGGSTRAVAGANZA: This event was held on April 9. It was felt that it went well and was good to hold this at the church. It was well attended and deemed a success with a good variety of activities, live bunnies, a costumed Easter Bunny.

LEADERSHIP TEAM GROUP UPDATES:

Building & Grounds: Prior to the meeting, Chad provided an updated list for review. He brought forward the following:

- * Handicap ramp needs to be repaired or replaced.
- * Some pews are cracking. It is felt this is not an integrity issue but will be monitored.
- * Water leak in kitchen ceiling where ductwork comes in from AC unit
- * "Church Parking Only" signs are up in the east alley way and on the poles in the parking lot.

FINANCE: The financial statements were reviewed. We continue to be in the black.

SPR: Sandee will be commissioned as a deacon at Annual Conference in June. SPR recommended we gift her with a clerical robe. Abigail will host a "watch party" at the church for Sandee's commissioning on June 10th. Nursery help is still needed. Confirmation will be April 30-May 1. There will be a youth lock-in May 21-22. Pastor Jen gave a reminder that a 12th person is needed for Leadership Team.

MINISTRY: Mission projects continue to be performed by a variety of groups at church. These include: supplies and support for staff and students at Roosevelt, Shoebox Christmas, Sewing Group makes covers for solar ovens. Update was given on Aric Leadabrand's *Save the Innocent* work with Ukrainians.

Motion by Sarah; 2nd by Mike to go into Executive Session at 6:55.

Declared out of Executive Session at 7:30.

With Pastor Abigail being reassigned by the Minnesota Conference, discussion was held concerning the salary for a new associate pastor should one become available for First Church. After discussion, motion by Sarah; 2nd by Mike that the proposed salary will be \$44,000 with a \$15,000 housing allowance. Motion passed.

Meeting concluded with Breakthrough Prayer.


