On all days, this practice of centering on gratitude before I go to bed each night has become an opportunity to remember the invitation in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, to "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Jesus Christ for you."

Several years ago, I moved this practice of private prayer into a practice of written prayer for the month of November. Each day throughout the month, I take time to write down at least one thing I am thankful for. I'm not sure what it is, exactly, that makes the practice of writing down my gratitude different than praying through it, but it is. On social media, this gained some traction for a while as people turned from private journaling, to sharing their gratitude publicly in a challenge called something along the lines of "30 days of Gratitude."

Whether we share it on social media or write it in a journal that is between you and God, I find merit in setting aside time to practice gratitude. Admittedly, I haven't done this in a few years, but this year, I want to return to this practice, and I want to invite you to join me. Specifically, I hope you will join me in reflecting on *unique* reasons to be grateful. We are all thankful for friends and family and a good meal. Yet I wonder: how are we thankful in unexpected moments that catch us off guard, or take our breath away? What are the unique things that stand out in our reflections that invite us to be grateful in difficult times, or in unexpected places?

For example: why might you be grateful for screaming children, or cold weather, or lots of traffic? What gifts await you when your plans fall through, your life is too busy, or your house is a mess? Is there a reason to be grateful when you have to stop and fill up that gas tank? Or stay an extra hour late at work? Or when you accidentally burn dinner?

There is a silver lining in every circumstance, and often, those linings are blessings waiting to be recognized. This November, I hope you will join me in celebrating my favorite (secular) holiday of Thanksgiving not just for one day, but all month long. As we do so, may our gratitude shape and refine us, reminding us to give thanks to God, who gives us all things.

AGENDA:

FOUNDATION UPDATE: Glen Vilhauer and John Redlinger presented an update on the Foundation. The purpose of the Foundation is to benefit the church. They feel there is a good relationship between the church and the Foundation. Foundation bylaws allow for expenditures of up to 5% of the value of the investments.

ELEVATOR ISSUES: The original installer was here on Monday. He gave an option that will be done soon.

An architect looked things over. She will be sending a report with options.

PARKING LOT SIGNAGE: Jenkins employees parking along the east side of the building in alley and in the church parking lot continues to be a concern. This concern has been expressed to Jenkins administration many times. There are many activities at church and the parking lot is needed for these church activities. The *Church Parking Only* signs are not enough to give the message.

DENOMINATIONAL UPDATE/CONVERSATION: Some United Methodist Churches are choosing to leave the denomination through disaffiliation. This is not an official denominational split, it is a splinter group of churches who are unhappy and leaving. Pastor Jen will be sharing information about this to any groups in the church who would like more information.

SPECIAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE NOVEMBER 19: The agenda will include one business item: consideration of resolutions ratifying the disaffiliation of local churches from The United Methodist Church. Our church can send 7 delegates to this. Those expressing an interest include: Mike & Kathie Grann, Barb Brinkman, Sue Luken, Ronda Boughton, April Geffre.

2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCE: This will be held June 8 – 10 in Sioux Falls. April, Barb, Mike, and Sue are interested in attending.

NEW POTENTIAL LEADERSHIP TEAM MEMBERS (2023 – 2025): Mike and Chad have completed their terms on the Leadership Team, so there are 2 openings.

NEW PARAMENTS: Paraments is the official church word for things like altar cloths and the cloths hanging on the pulpit. Ours are showing a great deal of wear. Memorial Fund money will be used to purchase new paraments and banners.

FARMLAND UPDATE: The owner of adjacent land is requesting a variance to build on his land.

CHRISTMAS EVE / CHRISTMAS DAY WORSHIP: There will be 2 services on Christmas Eve at 4:00 and 7:00. Christmas Day is on a Sunday; there will be one service at 10:00. New Year's weekend will have services at the following times: Saturday at the usual time of 5:00. Sunday will have one service at 10:00.

PASTORS UPDATES: Pastor Bryce is applying for a Breakthrough Ministry Grant from the Dakotas Conference. The focus of this grant is to reach young adults.

Pastor Jen proposed that our church become part of the Oasis Network. This is a network of churches committed to welcome and care for those who were members of United Methodist congregations that voted to disaffiliate but would like to remain a United Methodist. This is an opportunity for intentional hospitality.

Motion by Sarah; 2nd by Lea Ann that Watertown First UMC become part of the Dakotas Oasis Network of Churches. Motion passed.

LEADERSHIP TEAM GROUP UPDATES:

BUILDING & GROUNDS: The ramp on the NE side of the church is in. There are things that need tweaking that will be taken care of soon.

FINANCE: Finance is meeting to set the budget. Pledge letters are being sent. ACH giving is being promoted.

2023 staff wage increase was presented. Motion by Doug; 2nd by April to accept this as proposed. Motion passed.

SPR: There have been interviews for custodian. This is a part time position.

It is Pastor Appreciation Month. We have extended this to include all staff. There are gift bags in the back of the sanctuary. All are encouraged to write notes of appreciation.

MINISTRY: There are many projects.

The Harvest Table has been successful and is now winding down. Extra produce has been taken to Salvation Army. The donations will be given to a program that helps ease hunger. September 21 a group volunteered to work at Feeding South Dakota in Sioux Falls.

September 28 Food Give Away was successful. Next one will be November 9.

PACH donations of money and food continue.

Shoebox Christmas: approximately 75 Christmas gift boxes were assembled to be given to children on reservations in North and South Dakota and Minnesota.

Roosevelt School Outreach – we have volunteered to help with the Fall Carnival on Friday, October 28.

Advent Festival – We are hoping to have an Advent Festival this year.

Diaper Giveaway was successful.

Ukrainian settlement effort – Watertown is a pilot community.


