This year during Advent, First Church will be focusing on this tradition of preparing and reflecting. You are invited to join us as we seek to **"Be Expectant,"** together exploring the Christmas story with a lens of wonder and exploration, looking for ways God continues to come to us today. This new series will be an invitation to hear the familiar story of Jesus' birth in ways that invite us to be open to let go of our former (or worldly) expectations, instead letting what God is doing anew today wash over us with joyful anticipation.

Perhaps you want to take a leap of faith, spreading Christmas cheer by giving generous gifts like those found in our Alternate Gift Fair (see page 8 for more details). Maybe it's something else altogether, and you have ideas to share with us about how to move beyond our usual expectations as we seek to honor God in this season especially?

However you prepare for the coming of the Christ Child, I hope you'll join us at First Church as we seek to do so with renewed expectations and hope, looking to our future with joyful anticipation.


