During our First Church summer sermon series called *Trajectory: From Our Origins to Us*, we are taking this idea of learning from others and applying it to our early ancestors. We will examine how our lives as part of the church have been impacted by those before us. We are going to dive into the life of the early church, some of our church origins in fact, in seeking to understand our faith better now in 2023. Specifically, we will trace the early church in Ephesus through the books of Acts, Ephesians, and Revelation. Our study will give us a chance to analyze the growth and development of Christ's earliest followers as they learned to be the church following Jesus' death and resurrection.

This summer, while some may be going on trips to places near and far, I invite you to embark on a trip with me to the early church in Ephesus. No, we will not be traveling to Turkey, where the church of Ephesus would have been located. You can keep your passport tucked away and your camera in its case (or your phone). Your suitcases can remain in storage and your clothes can stay in the dresser. Instead, your Bible and willingness to worship, learn, and be transformed by God are all that is needed for this adventure. Who knows what we might discover about ourselves, our life as a church, and our faith in a God that has remained with us and will remain with us across all of time.

The scripture above from 1 Timothy, which is a letter addressed in context to the Ephesian church, tells us that we will be able to do the work of Jesus Christ when we are, "nourished on the truths of the faith and the good teaching" that we have followed. Friends in Christ, we have been following those teachings and good truths for years and years. Let us continue to learn from our ancestors who have passed on the life of Christ for us today.

See you for worship as we follow the trajectory from our church origins to us!

June Mission of the Month...

"The Road of Hope" 2023 Miracle Offering

The Walk to Emmaus (Luke 24: 13-35) serves as the scriptural foundation for our conference theme. This story, found only in the Gospel of Luke, is one of movement: two disciples "are going" (24:13), Jesus "came near and went with them" (24:15), they "came near" Emmaus (24:28), Jesus "walked ahead of them" (24:28), "he went in to stay with them" (24:29), "he vanished from their sight" (24:31), and "they got up and returned to Jerusalem" (24:33). Some of the verbs tell of movements made by Jesus; others tell of the two disciples: Jesus and his followers are on the move. But it is not movement for its own sake. The moves being made in this narrative have a purpose, and that is to tell the story of the resurrected Christ, to interpret it, to locate ourselves in it, and to share it all with others. The 2023 Miracle Offering: Road of Hope invites us into an opportunity to walk alongside those on the journey toward health and wholeness and to share the healing and transforming love of Christ.

According to a recent study by the CDC, more than **four out of every ten (42%)** high school students feel persistently sad or hopeless and **nearly one-third (29%)** experienced poor mental health. In the Dakotas, **47.5%** of South Dakota youth and **54.6%** of North Dakota youth, age 12–17, who have depression did not receive any care in the last year.

Additionally, suicide is the second-leading cause of death among people aged 15 to 24 in the United States. Nearly **20%** of high school students report serious thoughts of suicide and **9%** have made an attempt to take their lives, according to the National Alliance on Mental Illness.

In response to the increasing numbers of deaths by suicide, ideation of suicide, and attempts among youth in North and South Dakota, and the mental health crisis in our nation, the 2023 Miracle Offering recipients are: Helpline of South Dakota and First-Link of North Dakota. Our goal for the 2023 Miracle Offering is \$50,000 to be shared with Helpline of South Dakota and FirstLink of North Dakota.

These organizations provide free and confidential services including listening and support, referrals to resources/help, and crisis intervention. Phone help-lines are available 24/7, for anyone who is experiencing a mental health or other crisis. Programs are available to provide resources, support, and education and to connect individuals and families with the services they need.

I encourage each congregation to begin praying for and preparing to participate in this offering, through which we will tangibly share God's extravagant love with a hurting world. Please invite the members and friends of your congregation to experience the joy of giving generously of themselves to touch the lives of others with God's compassion and grace. Thank you for your extravagant generosity, your commitment to offering help and hope to a world in need, and your passion for sharing the love of Christ in your everyday life.

AGENDA:

Elevator Issues and Options: Accessibility Access Committee has been formed and had their first meeting. They plan to meet monthly. The next step is to draft the request for proposals.

Annual Conference: Annual Conference is June 8–10 in Sioux Falls. Our church has 6 lay delegates. The Miracle Offering this year is The Road of Hope. The Walk to Emmaus (Luke 24: 13-35) serves as the scriptural foundation for our conference theme. The offering will support Crisis Intervention and Support. In SD this will go to SD Helpline Center.

Water Issues: All water issues are taken care of except carpet in the 5-6th grade classroom. This will be installed soon.

Pastor Updates:

Pastor Bryce: Alayna Nelson will be an intern this summer. She will begin the week of Annual Conference and continue until mid-August.

The youth summer mission trip is fully funded. This trip will be July 22-29.

Youth group is wrapping up. The youth have requested a summer Bible study.

The newly formed young adult group is meeting monthly.

Pastor Jen: Melissa Gall is a Deacon. She has requested Watertown First United Methodist church as her secondary appointment. This means she will be connected to our church as her faith home, but will keep her full time employment in Milbank schools.

The Oasis Network was formed by Dakotas Conference to welcome and care for those who want to remain United Methodist but had belonged to a church that disaffiliated. We are asked to consider how our church can be more intentional about caring for these. There will be a ZOOM for churches who have agreed to be an Oasis church. Pastor Jen, Barb, and Sue will participate in this.

We have 50 new professing members since September (this does not include the children who are not yet confirmed). This includes those who will be joining on May 21.

Pastor Jen will begin her Rest and Renewal Leave on

May 24. We have pulpit supply, a visiting Pastor in Residence, and extra Pastoral Care support all lined up so Pastor Bryce has all of the support he needs to ensure everything is covered while she is away.

LEADERSHIP TEAM GROUP UPDATES:

Building & Grounds: The heat tape on the roof needs reinstalling/replacing. The bids were discussed but clarification is needed before a bid is accepted.

Finance: It was decided that only 3rd and 4th Quarterly Statements will be mailed.

SPŔ: Custodian Steve is on medical leave. Randy Middleton is filling in. We continue to need help in the nursery.

Ministry: Bundles of Hope diaper give away was a success. There is a great need for this ministry in our community. 12,500 diapers were given away. 130 children from 60 families received diapers. Mission of the Month: May is VBS. June will be the Miracle Offering. July will be ShoeBox Christmas. Our church will be providing airfare for a Ukrainian family of 3 who is relocating in Watertown. We are in need of donations to support this ministry.

Meeting concluded with the *Breakthrough Prayer*.

Foundation Update

Your Foundation Board of Directors recently amended the Articles of Incorporation. Previously the Foundation was limited to grant making of 5% of the previous end of year asset value for "special non-budgeted projects of the congregation." As the Board had generally been reactive only when a request was made of the Foundation, much of this 5% was not being utilized on an annual basis. In an effort to increase the Board's flexibility in working with the Leadership Team and pastors an amendment was filed with the Secretary of State's office to allow for distributions for "special projects" of the congregation. This may include expenditures that have been budgeted, but for which some assistance is required. Further, whatever is unspent each year from the 5% allowed may be carried over for use in future years at the discretion of the Board on an annual basis.

The feeling was that these changes will better utilize the assets of the Foundation and allow the Board to be more proactive in its mission in working in collaboration with the Leadership team and pastors.
