Over the past several weeks, I've been reading and reflecting on the many gifts and nuances of the creation stories in Genesis. I'm not sure what it is that has drawn me into this familiar story, but I keep coming back to it. I keep finding gifts in the wonder, the miracle, even the comfort of the rhythm and order offered to us in the pattern of creation over 7 days as told in Genesis 1.

There are so many things to reflect on here, from the miracle of God creating all that is out of nothing, to the ways things are given names, to the wonder of what that first sunrise or sunset looked like on that first day when God created light and darkness. Most of all, I appreciate that no matter what God did or created on each of the first 6 days described, God saw all that was before them, and called it good.

Yet it was on Day 6 that God created humans.

"Then God said, 'Let us make humanity in our image to resemble us..." (Genesis 1:26 CEB) "God saw everything he had made: it was supremely good. There was evening and there was morning: the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31 CEB)

It was "supremely" good, it says. I love this descriptor that is different from other days simply being good. On this day, it was supremely good, after creating humans in God's likeness.

Then, in this abundance of goodness, we are told God rested on Day 7.

It makes me wonder: are we keeping our eyes open for that which is *supremely good* in our midst? Are we creating opportunity to rest into the goodness that is already within and around us? By this, I mean: part of what was so very good about God's creation, was the gift of being together in community. The gift of being set apart to live life together, and to care for one another and all of creation that is around us.

Part of the gift of my time of Renewal Leave over the summer was the ability to seek – and rest into – the gift of creation that is all around us. While sometimes that took the glorious form of hiking a mountain in a national park, most days it looked like spending time in the dirt pulling weeds or mowing the grass. Yet I found joy and wonder in it all because for the first time, these weren't just tasks to be done, but opportunities to *be* in creation. To wonder anew about the miracle of God's creation that is as wide as the entire universe, and as specific as each blade of grass.

Taking time to rest into the wonder of these miracles is indeed *supremely good* – and it makes me wonder: where are you taking time apart to see and wonder about the miracles of God? Where do you see that which is *supremely good* around and within you?

This week (month, year, lifetime...), might you take time to do just that. To pause. To *rest*. To marvel at the wonder of God's creation as you pause to see, to know, and to give thanks for all that is supremely good.

### •What, you may be asking, is a Carillon Bell System?

- ♦ A Carillon consists of a series of at least 23 tuned bells that can be programmed to play a broad range of music.
- ♦ Carillons can be heard throughout North America in cities, at churches, on school campuses, in public parks and many other places where people gather.
- ♦ When First Church was built in 1914 there was a huge bell in the bell tower that was rung to signify the start of worship and other
- ♦ At that time in history some folks may not have had another device to help them tell time, so this bell system was a welcome sound in the community.
- ♦ Many years ago our church installed an electric bell system which could be programmed to play music at certain times of the day which was enjoyed by many in our church as well as in the community.
- ♦ With time our system has become obsolete. A new Electronic Carillon System is now available to replace the system we currently have that is no longer operational.

We hope that the proceeds from the Fall Festival will help us obtain a new Carillon Bell System so we can once again enjoy the music to signify events in our church and also provide scholarships so that anyone who wishes to go to church camp is able.

### AGENDA:

**Investment account update:** Adam Fox presented an update on the church investments. YTD the investments have seen a 7.5% growth.

**Carpet issue in the nursery:** The seams are raveling. The workers will be here soon to repair this.

**Christmas Eve Services:** We will begin celebrating Advent the weekend after Thanksgiving.

Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year. We will have one service at 10:00 on Sunday morning, celebrating Christmas Eve with Holy Communion. There will be no Saturday service on December 23. There will be no 8:30 service Sunday morning. Christmas Eve services will also be at 4:00 and 7:00.

Accessibility Team Updates: The team met on Monday, September 11. They looked at the survey results.

Handicap parking spots were discussed. Currently there are spots alongside the green space. On weekends this doesn't seem to be adequate to meet the needs of our congregation. After discussion, there was a motion by Corrine; 2<sup>nd</sup> Peggy to put signage along the east side of the building designating that as "Limited Mobility Parking." Motion Passed.

**Church Insurance:** We now have our property insurance through Church Mutual Insurance.

**Fall KickOff – Sunday, September 17:** Fall Kickoff will be at Foundation Plaza on Kemp Ave. A signup sheet has been passed around during worship services. More help is needed.

**Pigeon Issues:** The Mitigation Company recommended installing secure screening and vents. Peggy will contact the company and follow-up on this.

**Oasis Partnerships:** Our church agreed to be an Oasis Church. Britton UMC has no pastor. We will share resources with them. One way is that they will share the message from our Saturday service at their Sunday worship service during Advent.

**Fresh Expression Training September 30** in Sioux Falls: Fresh Expressions is a new concept from the conference. Church does not have to happen in the church building; it can go to where the people are. Pastor Bryce and Lucas and others from our church will be attending this. Lucas is on the conference team for Fresh Expressions.

**Leadership Team Terms:** The three year terms for Lea Ann, Ronda, Doug, & Sue are expiring in December. They have the option to renew for another 3 years. They will let Pastor Jen know their decision soon.

### **PASTOR UPDATES:**

**Pastor Bryce** is absent tonight because he is attending a Project Innovate Conference in Indiana.

The young adults group now has a name – Impact. They will meet the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of the month at 6:00. The programming will center around our church themes of *Connect – Grow – Serve*.

**Pastor Jen:** A new member class will be starting next week. We need a new custodian; she has received on application. We need one more person for the nursery. Because Pastor Pete, pastor at Brookings UMC, had to go back to South Africa for a funeral, she has been helping in Brookings.

We received the following through Foundation grants: a new TV in the nursery and the choir loft. New batteries and equipment that convert our current assisted listening devices into being compatible with telecoil equipped hearing aids. 


