## Accessibility Team Update

This past May, I gathered together a team of 11 leaders from our congregation to begin the process of assessing some of our building's accessibility needs. Admittedly, this conversation has come up a number of times since I first arrived in 2020. With the recent breakdowns of our existing lift (elevator) deeming it unreliable, I wanted us to have a plan for how to move forward before we once again find ourselves without a way for those with limited mobility to access even our sanctuary or fellowship hall.

The makeup of this team is intentional, including representation from our current Leadership Team and Foundation Board, as well as diverse members of our congregation (age, ability, time of membership, expertise to offer, etc.). At our inaugural meeting we talked through the challenges and tasks before us, including a tentative timeline (that has already been adjusted) for moving forward together.

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Since May, our team has worked hard looking at the overall accessibility needs

in our building (including making a few updates that could be done immediately, such as adding a hand rail to one of the kitchen entrances). We have prayerfully and carefully evaluated what the biggest priorities of our work before us should be. We have also solicited information and feedback from you – our congregation – to be sure the next steps taken are in line with the desires not just of those on our team, but of our entire community.

Information from our survey helped our Accessibility Team prioritize needs to make our building optimally accessible. As a result, an RFP ("Request for Proposals") has been sent out to seven (7) architectural firms, and we are hopeful we will receive proposals from several of them by mid-November. These proposals will not offer details of what our building or construction plans may be as much as they will be purely conceptual submissions. These will offer us big picture ideas and considerations about what we should expect moving forward into future design and building phases. These will include but not be limited to building related codes we need to be mindful of, going over general accessibility needs, and making recommendations around security, costs, and more.

Upon receiving these proposals, our Accessibility Team plans to meet with and interview firms we wish to consider working with moving forward. It is our intention to make a final decision on which firm our Team recommends working with moving forward, and to offer that information at our **Charge Conference** (6pm on November 28). Please plan to join us for this meeting, at which all members of First Church are welcome to attend and have both voice and vote! As a reminder: this is our Annual Meeting of the church at which we do important tasks such as pass our budget for the upcoming year and celebrate ministry happening in our church. Our District Superintendent, Rev. Kris Mutzenberger, will be present with us in this time, and will also lead us in our vote the Accessibility Team proposes.

To be clear: this will *not* be a vote on what construction will take place, or what changes we may make to enable more accessibility. It is merely an opportunity to vote to move forward (or not) with hiring the recommended architecture firm so they can help us come up with designs that would help us address the accessibility needs of our building. We hope you will join us for this meeting, and join us in prayerfully looking to God's guidance so that we may continue moving forward caring for our beloved building that has enabled ministry over the past 100+ years, in the present, and for generations yet to come.

# Send in your Questions!

This fall we have been focusing on getting "Back to Basics" in our faith. We started with a series that talked about foundational pieces of our faith (prayer, scripture, worship, etc.) before moving on to the basics of our faith as lived out in our membership vows through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. We will move from there into more of the basic, foundational parts of who we are as we reflect on the season of Advent leading up to Christmas by having a "Simple Christmas" this year (more on that to come).

As we lean into this year's theme of connecting the basics of our faith with our every day lives, I cannot help but to wonder: what are some of the basic (or not so basic) parts of your faith you feel you've missed out on, or wonder about?

Over the past year, Pastor Bryce and I have gotten to have some fun with our Thursday morning Bible Study when they have invited us down as they "stump the Pastors" (okay, they don't call it that, but sometimes it feels that way as they get to ask anything they want and we do our best to answer). It makes me wonder what other kinds of questions they – or you all – might have... and why it takes moments like these for us to make space for talking about them.

I wonder: Are there questions *you* have always wondered about, but have never had the courage or opportunity to ask? I hope so, because I want to use those questions – questions you have that surely others have as well – as the foundation for an upcoming sermon series. What might *you* want to hear your pastors talk more about? Help you dive deeper into? Whether it is a question about life (or death), faith (or doubt), church or a specific scripture passage or anything else you can connect your faith to: this is your chance to ask us anything!

My hope is that there will be far more questions than we will have time to get to, so I can't promise that we will get to *all* of them. For those we don't get to in this initial series, I do hope to use them in future worship planning – it's even possible some of your questions will give birth to series we may use in the future. If you have a question you would like to submit, there are several ways to do so. You may send me an email (seniorpastor@watertownfirst.church), or write it on a connect card during worship in coming weeks. You'll have a few weeks to think about your questions, but they all need to be <u>submitted by</u> **Sunday**, **November 19**.

Creating space for honest questions is an important way to ensure we are growing in our discipleship, wherever on that journey you are. I look forward to diving into some of these tough questions together in the coming year.

## **Meals On Wheels Needs Your Help**

- <u>The next week for First Church to deliver is Nov. 27—Dec. 1 and drivers</u> <u>are needed!</u>

#### Do you have a few hours a year to volunteer? MOW may be just the program that fits your schedule!

How does "Meals On Wheels" work?

- First Church is responsible for meal deliveries 5 weeks out of the year (about every other month).
- The food preparation and starting point for MOW is at the Sixties Plus Dining Room located at the Senior Center at 26 1st Ave SW.
- Drivers are asked to arrive between 10:30am 10:45am to pick up the food totes.
- A clip board provided for each route includes the name, phone number and address for each recipient along with clear instructions for where the food should be dropped off at each location. For example, several people leave coolers on their doorstep for food to be placed inside.
- There are 10 routes daily and each route has 6 10 delivery locations.
- Each route takes about 30 45 minutes or less depending on the assigned route. Assuming 45 minutes and a start time of 10:45am, a route could be completed by 11:30am. That totals less than 20 hours per year for 5 weeks of deliveries!
- Food totes are returned to the Sixties Plus Dining Room at the end of deliveries each day
- One driver per route is needed; however, some married couples or friends team up in one vehicle.
- If a driver has a conflict arise due to personal appointments, obligations, etc., a substitute driver is scheduled to fill in. Some drivers are snowbirds and drive during the months they are in Watertown; substitute drivers are scheduled for the remaining months.
- We do not drive in inclement weather during the winter months.
