That's how I have felt in multiple situations over the course of my young life, and it doesn't take me long to recall several instances where I have been confused. Instances like filing taxes, figuring out insurance, or understanding the intricacies of systematic theology (which learning about for me felt like listening to someone read a book about the Hebrew language written in Portuguese, what a headache).

Complex situations are especially prominent around the holiday season that require careful thought and planning. Maybe your situations are like mine. How do we coordinate spending Christmas with multiple families who live 1,000 miles apart (my family is in Rapid City and my wife, Meaghan's family is in Dallas, TX)? Or what gifts do we get everyone and how do we ensure we spend equal amounts on each person?

Complexity and confusion will always follow us in every aspect of life because unlike God, we can't know everything. In the times we are in over our head, we need someone to teach us. We need someone to show us how to move forward. When it comes to the story of Jesus' birth, we are doing just that. We are looking to God to learn the simple truths God has to teach us about the complex story of Jesus' birth.

During the Advent season this year, that is the four weeks of preparation leading up to Christmas, we are going to look at the story of Jesus' birth from the opposite end of confusing. We are going to look at the simplicity of how God is at work in the Christmas story. We're going to turn to the simple acts of faithfulness that show us the truth of God and God's people in the story that most of us are already very familiar with. Instead of making things more complicated, we're going to simplify.

While our lives are full of Christmas activity and preparation, we seek to hear God speaking a simple truth into our often complex and busy lives. Our hope is that by simplifying, we will have space to hear, see, and know God where we might not have before.

The scripture above from Psalm 16 is a good reminder for us when it comes to the times of life that feel like a lot or the situations that have no easy answers and might leave us confused. God will show us the way. "You teach me the way of life." God teaches us what we need to live faithfully and points us to the peace, hope, love, and joy found in the birth of baby Jesus among us, the presence of God among us. That is something to truly celebrate!

I look forward to simply preparing and celebrating the birth of Jesus with you at church!

We are very thankful for the ongoing ways that youth in our congregation participate in the life of our church as we all learn together how to deepen and live out our faith in both large and small ways.







My name is Tetiana (short name is Tania). I was born on October 19, 1981 in the village of Mikhaylivka, Skadovsky District, Kherson region. I went to school here. I studied very well.

After school, I entered the economic and law institute in the Kherson (on September 1999).

Specialty – accounting and audit. I studied at the initiative well. Participated in the national accounting Olympiads.

After graduating from the institute, I rented an apartment and worked in some big companies in Kherson.

My parents divorced when I was 15 years old and my father moved to the Odessa region.

In 2012, I moved to his apartment in the town of Velikodolns'ke and worked in Odessa.

Maksym Krasniak (short name – Maks) was born on June 20 1979 in the town of Svessa of the Sumy Region. There he studied school, studied for an electrician in college, worked as an electrician and worked for 15 years as a driver in forestry. He raised his son on his own, now he is 21 years old.

We med in 2016. In 2017 I moved to live to Svessa with Maks, we got married. I gave birth the daughter Yevhenila (short name Zheniia) on January 7, 2018.

After maternity leave, I was invited to work in Kherson, to the company in which I worked for a long time before for a good position. In 2021, we moved to Kherson.

In Kherson, we lived all families and make plans for life. However, on February 24, 2022, war began. We were in Kherson until Maarch 10, 2022, we could not to move to Svessa, since the Russian troops occupied the square for Kherson near Chernobaevka and there was a battles. We left Kherson (because in Kherson were a lot of Russian soldiers and there is was restless) and we went for the village of Mikhaylivka Skadovsky District to my mother.

When it became restless in the village of Mikhaylivka too, in Novemter 2022 we left through Crimea, Russia, Belarus and Poland to the Czech Republic and lived there until July 2023

I applied for U4U and we arrived to the USA on the 17th of July.

AGENDA:

Carpet issue in the nursery: The seams are raveling. The carpet will be replaced at no cost to the church.

Accessibility Team Update: We have received 2 proposals from architects. The next step is to interview representatives from these firms. The results will be presented for a vote to move forward at Charge Conference on November 28.

Bat / Pigeon Issues: We are still looking for contractor to properly resolve the issue.

New LT Members: Heide Kuhlman and Marcia Schneider will be joining Leadership Team in January. There is still one opening.

Annual Conference 2024: This will be held in Bismarck, ND June 6-8. Our church can send 4 lay delegates.

Christmas Offering: Christmas Offering will be designated for Mission & Outreach Projects.

Community Lent Services: The host church for these noon services rotates between the downtown churches. Our church has been asked to host these in 2024.

PASTOR UPDATES:

Pastor Bryce: Last weekend Pastor Bryce took a group of 10 to DakYouth in Aberdeen.

The Youth Council meets to plan local activities. The youth will lead worship at all 3 services the weekend of November 18 - 19. He is beginning to put out feelers for a church van.

The last IMPACT activity, the young adult group, was to interact with residents at Stoneybrook. December activity is a cooking night.

Pastor Jen: This is a busy season. Our tech services are now all Microsoft based. Conference work has involved mentoring 2 newer pastors. In May, she will be participating in a pastoral pilgrimage which is a continuing education activity.

LEADERSHIP TEAM GROUP UPDATES:

Building & Grounds: Limited Mobility signs will soon be installed. The exhaust fan in the handicap accessible restroom near the fellowship hall needs replacing. It is recommended to get a commercial grade fan.

Roof - Heat tape has been installed. The company that was going to install snow cleats is not able to do this. Another company needs to be found so these can be installed before winter.

Finance: 2024 budget was reviewed. Motion by Peggy; 2nd April to approve the budget as proposed. Motion passed.

Current budget: This is the first year with a significant shortfall.

SPR: Beth Schutt has been hired as the custodian. SPR will be meeting individually with each staff member.
