“Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...” -Matthew 18:19 CEB

Methodism in the Americas grew like wildfire in the early 1700s across the settlements and colonies. It was a movement that occurred out in the fields, across the plains, and with gatherings on a hill or under a tree. Spreading the gospel didn't happen in a church building but rather wherever people were at. People didn't come to church, instead the church went to them. This method of sharing the gospel was particularly effective in reaching people who hadn't heard about Jesus or who had previously not been a part of the church.

Recently, another movement has been gaining traction. It's called Fresh Expressions. Leader of the movement, Rev. Michael Beck, says that “Once again, the Holy Spirit is up to something out in the fields with the “nones” (people who claim no religious affiliation or practice) and “dones” (people who once practiced a religion but no longer do) of our post-everything society.” The idea behind Fresh Expressions, is to get on board with what God is already doing in the world, outside of the church. If people aren't coming to church, Fresh Expressions is a way to bring church to the people. Remember, a church is people, not a building.

Fresh Expressions are literally what they sound like. They are a fresh or new expression of what it means to be a church. They are a fresh expression of church. Bible study and burritos, praise at a dog park, and dinner church are all examples of Fresh Expressions. So how do we jump on board this Fresh Expressions movement? There are three easy steps.

First, identify the places we already do life (home, work, the grocery store, restaurants, gas stations, dog parks, gyms, grain elevators, etc.).

Second, identify a Person of Peace (a person who is a bridge between First Church and the place of life. Example: A restaurant owner who allows a group to meet for Bible Study at their restaurant).

Third, cultivate a Fresh Expression. If you have an idea of a new Fresh Expression, and you've identified a possible Person of Peace, contact our First Church staff to see how we can help you grow that idea into a church reality.

Our hope here at First Church is that we could use Fresh Expressions as a way to join in what God is already doing in the world. Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. To do that we need to go out and make disciples.

If you feel the Holy Spirit tugging at your heart or nudging an idea in your mind, this is your sign to follow that feeling. Starting a fresh expression of church isn't something that everyone is called to do, but if it is something you feel called to do or learn more about, please contact our church staff as we begin to put a team together to join the Fresh Expression movement.

I can't wait to see what Fresh Expressions you come up with!

November 28, 2023

The Church Charge Conference was led by NE District Superintendent Rev. Kris Mutzenberger. Approximately 55 members were present including the following:

Rev. Mutzenberger opened the meeting with a devotion based on Philippians 4:4-20 with the theme being change or transformation of heart, mind, and action. We looked at our church through the lens of 5 P's Praise, Posture, Prayer, and Peace through Perspective.

PRAISE: In what areas of our church are we praising God?

A copy of our 2024 Missional Budget describing how our budget is utilized focused on our 5 Values was also distributed.

Accessibility Team Update

The elevator in the church is not reliable. The Accessibility Team has been meeting since May. During this time, the congregation was surveyed. The church has 13 levels. Not all of these need to be made accessible. The congregation was surveyed with one of the main questions being which areas are most important to be accessible. The top 3 were sanctuary, fellowship hall, and office area.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was sent to architectural firms.

Architects were interviewed.

In a project of this size, generally these are the steps that are followed.

1. Concept phase which includes hiring an architect.
2. Capital campaign
3. Design phase
4. Bid letting

The following motion was made by Sarah Caron: I make a motion that Watertown First United Methodist Church enter a contract with YHR Partners of Moorhead, MN in the amount of \$18,500 for completion of "Accessibility, Assessment, Conceptual Plan and Preliminary Budgeting" as described in the proposal dated November 9, 2023 after funding for these services has been secured.

Second by April Geffre

Discussion followed.

Motion Passed.

This meeting ended with prayer led by Rev. Kris Mutzenberger.

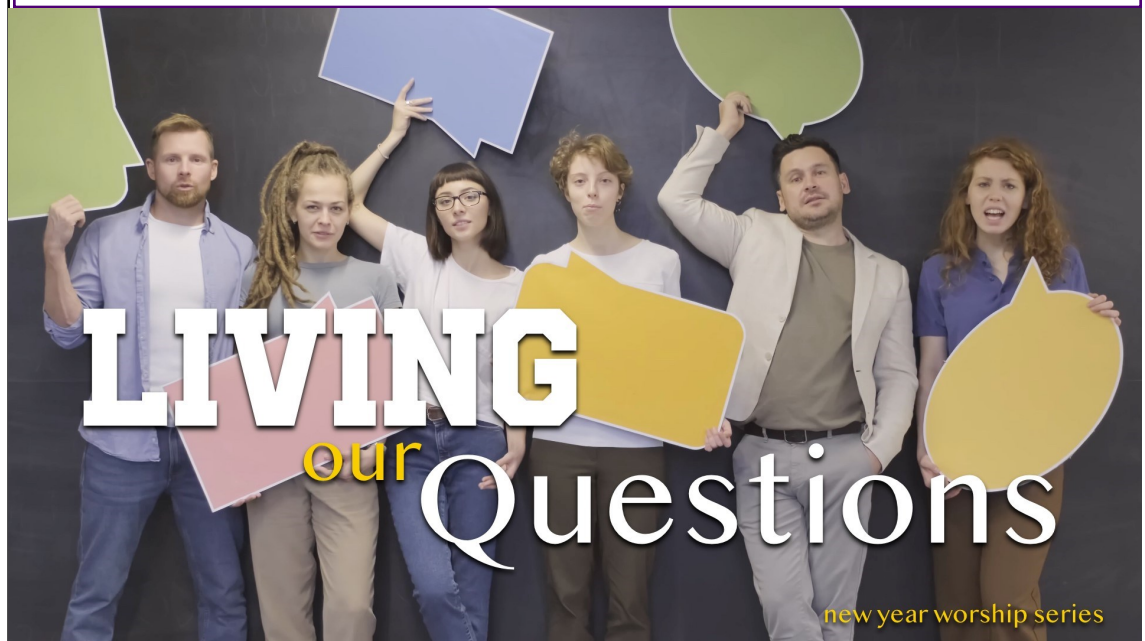
