PASTORS WORD

Everybody likes to joke with their pastor about sleeping in church, either because they are so tired it's a possibility or to remind us not to be boring. The few times I've seen people sleep in worship, besides the toddler flat out in a pew, there's been reason – someone coming in off a night-shift, another person finally relaxing after a hard week, or even a teenager there because they weren't given the option. I tend to think, if you are so tired you can sleep upright in a pew, then your body needs some rest. Take it when you can!

Everyone worships just a bit differently. For some its:

- ⇒ the quiet reverence of silence and contemplation. Letting the presence of God fill us.
- \Rightarrow the overwhelming music of the organ shaking us to our core.
- \Rightarrow the steady rhythms of a guitar letting the familiar speak.
- \Rightarrow the spoken liturgy of a call to worship inviting us in to participate.
- \Rightarrow the easy comfort of a simple service uncomplicated and laid back.
- \Rightarrow The fellowship before, during and after worship.

There are so many incredible examples of worship in the Bible – from the Psalms giving us the beautiful prayers and hymns we still share today.

Take Psalm 150 for example:

Praise the LORD! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty firmament! Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his surpassing greatness!

Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp! Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! Praise him with clanging cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that breathes praise the LORD! Praise the LORD!

Our psalmist would tell us our worship is entirely too quiet. If someone can sleep with the loud-clashing cymbals, I'd be impressed.

But the beauty of the worshipping community here at First United Methodist Church is that each different worship service brings an opportunity to connect to God.

<u>Saturday Night Worship (5:00 p.m.)</u>: A laid back worship service scheduled late in the day. The service gives an opportunity for late risers to gather comfortably to worship God. The music is contemporary and the order of worship is simplified. Coffee begins at 4:30 p.m. and casual clothing is the norm.

<u>Early Sunday Morning (8:30 a.m.)</u>: The communal prayers and formal liturgy are a hallmark of our early worship. The pastors wear robes and use the original pulpit giving a sense of formality to this service. Using the organ and hymns, the music fills the sanctuary regularly and our choir and bell choir regularly help lead. Coffee fellowship begins at 8:00 a.m.

Late Sunday Morning (10:00 a.m.): This service is a blend of all the rest. With a call and response to begin worship, this service pulls in some of the formal elements of the early service while combining the laid back atmosphere of our Saturday worship. Our music is a blend of old and new with occasional performances by our choir, bell choir and others. Coffee fellowship begins at 9:30 a.m.

LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING— TUESDAY, JANUARY 14—5:30 PM

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: Sue Luken shared a devotion entitled An Ever-Ready Heart based on Deuteronomy 6:4-7 with emphasis on verse 6 – These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts.

AGENDA:

ACCESSIBILITY TEAM UPDATE: Pastor Sara has been visiting with representatives with YHR, the architect firm.

SECURITY SYSTEM PROPOSAL: The current security system was discussed. It is not reliable for recording as it has become obsolete. Quotes were received from 2 companies; 3 Cord Enterprise and 3D Security Inc. Motion by Adam; 2nd by Stephanie to purchase the security system from 3D Security Inc. Motion passed. Adam will send a request for this to the Foundation.

OLD ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT: There are old TVs, computer monitors, and other equipment that is outdated and therefore not being used. It was the consensus that these should be donated to an agency that could use them. The sound booth needs a new monitor.

CARILLON BELL SYSTEM: Lisa Stydel along with LeaAnn Alwin and Michael Stydel presented information about a new Carillon Bell System. The current carillon system is obsolete and has not been operational for several years. Some of the proceeds from the 2023 Fall Festival and all of the proceeds from the 2024 Fall Festival were designated for the Carillon System. This is approximately \$7100. Total moneys designated for the Carillon System are approximately \$11,000. The cost of the system is approximately \$18,000. Before the system could be installed, the bell tower needs to be cleaned because pigeons have inhabited this area resulting in a mess of feathers, carcasses, and pigeon droppings. The cost of this is approximately \$2500. Motion by Sue L; 2nd by Stephanie to move forward with the carillon system project. About half of the funds have been raised, the Foundation will be asked for the remainder of the funds. Motion passed. Lisa Stydel will request the funds from the Foundation. Because the pigeon droppings and dust and carcasses can cause health concerns, it is felt the bell tower needs to be cleaned by professionals.

LEADERSHIP TEAM MEMBER FOR FOUNDATION:

Adam Fox will be the LT representative on the Foundation.

PASTOR UPDATES:

Pastor Bryce: Pastor Bryce attended a conference that focused on Children and Youth Ministries. He reported that it was a worthwhile conference.

He is excited for youth to be back and regular programming is back after Christmas break. They are busy raising funds for the Chicago Mission Trip. The trip is June 21-26. Currently 11 youth are signed up to go. They are working with a group called Praying Pelican Missions. One upcoming fundraiser is "A Night to Remember" scheduled for February 12.

Pastor Sara: Pastor Sara sent her report to Pastor Bryce. Pastor Bryce has been focusing on pastoral care and outreach. She wants to reach out to those with a connection to our church. She is working with the Prayer Team. She is also working on accessibility team work. The current sermon series is *Constructing a Life*. The next series will be *Wisdom*.

LEADERSHIP TEAM GROUP UPDATES:

Building & Grounds: Pastor Sara sent the following concerns that need to be addressed. * door handle on east side near choir loft * west stairwell to fellowship hall needs painting * drainage from downspouts on east side of Cook Hall to the alley causes icy conditions. Other items: Confirm when the AC in Fellowship Hall will be installed. The east entry needs painting.

Beth installed puck lights in the balcony before the Community Christmas Concert.

Finance: We ended 2024 behind but not as far behind as was expected.

Audit: At the Charge Conference the district

superintendent asked if an audit had been done in the last 2 years. Since it has not, this needs to be completed.

Inventory: This also needs to be completed.

Ministry: The January Mission of the Month is LaGonave Alive - A Haiti Ministry. This group is looking for outreach opportunities to connect the community with the church.

Results of the Advent Alternative Giving Mission are: 30 families contributed and we raised \$60.00 for the Solar Oven Project \$571.00 for Glacial Lakes Humane Society \$850.00 for Heifer International

\$3,093.00 for the Youth Mission Trip to Chicago The congregation is invited to help pack foodsacks for the PACH program on Monday, March 17.

SPR: We have had one applicant for LT; there are 3 openings. Due to health reasons, Sandy Middleton has resigned as one of the Children's Ministry Coordinators. We will celebrate her ministry on Sunday, January 19 during the 10:00 worship service. Job descriptions for the Children's Ministry Coordinators have been revised. These were presented to LT.

Meeting concluded with the *Breakthrough Prayer*.

Next meeting: The next meeting will be February 11, 2025 at 5:30. Devotions will be by Adam.


