I have strived to give of myself in ministry here at First Church out of a foundation of God's love, trusting that God is equipping me along the way and using me for a good work. Friends, this is what I encourage us all to during this time of transition. Change is not always easy, and it regularly is met with fear and worry. But God continues to call us forward in faithfulness. It is our job to trust where God is leading and to act in love with all that we think, speak, and do.

It is in this spirit of trust in God and the intention to love like Jesus that I came to Watertown. It is with this spirit and intention that I look to where God is calling me beyond First Church. I leave knowing that the good work God has done while I was here will continue in Watertown long after I am gone. The consistency of God gives us hope.

I am filled with gratitude in my heart for the ways you have all trusted me and shown Christ's love to me. You have given me a place to belong, to learn, and to grow as a person and as a minister. First Church, you truly have been a blessing. THANK YOU and goodbye for now.

Devotion & Opening Prayer was given by April Geffre.

April opened the meeting at 5:35.

#### Accessibility Team Update: Nothing to report

Adam Fox Reported on the Security System. The new system has been ordered.

**Summer Worship Hours:** Saturday worship will stay on Saturday night at 5:00. Sunday morning worship will combine at 9:30 a.m. This will begin on Memorial Day Weekend Sunday, May 25<sup>th</sup>.

**Pastor Updates:** Other than the Associate Pastor, we are fully staffed.

Pastor Bryce reported the June 21-26 Chicago Trip is fully funded. Graduate weekend this Saturday and Sunday. Whether they are graduating from High School or higher education. Wednesday night youth program is done this Wednesday. A Youth Bible Study will be led by Cady Weidner, our Intern, throughout the summer. Vacation Bible School will be from July 21-24 starting at 4 years old or preschool. There will be a youth lock in on 5/23/2025 which will be the last hooray for the group. Beth Lalim will be speaking to the youth prior to the Chicago trip about homelessness. Pastor Bryce has been asked to offer a prayer at the Henry Graduation. And of course his transfer to North Dakota.

Pastor Sara reported that Holy Week and Easter Week went well. Saying goodbye to Sandy and having a secondary funeral for the youth programming the week of her funeral. Focus has shifted again with Pastor Byrce leaving. There are no pastors available to replace him. Kris Mutzenberger will speak to the group later on to see where we are with that. The average of Youth/Associate Pastors is 18 months, which Pastor Bryce has been here much longer than that. Pastor Byce's last weekend will be the last weekend of June

**Building and Ground:** The timer for the lights on the stained glass window has been replaced. The commercial dishwasher is leaking. Josh will check this out. The light in the lounge will be looked at by Muth Electric as they were the ones that put it in 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  years ago. There has been no one contacted on the plaster on the ceiling in the sanctuary but will be put on hold temporarily.

**Finance:** April reported that we are not in the black but we are definitely better that we were in prior years. This period income was \$36,958.44 where expenses were \$39,748.34 for a difference of negative \$2,789.90.

**SPR:** Sue Luken reported that we have been busy with staff positions. At our May meeting we found out that Pastor Bryce was being transferred to Valley City, ND. We will have a time to say good bye to him and to celebrate

his ordination. Pastor Sara has been working on the praise band at the Saturday worship service. This is going well. Bobbie Jenner has been hired as the weekend Children's Ministry Coordinator. We have been in discussion for ways to fill the variety of hats that Pastor Byrce wears.

**Ministry:** Pastor Bryce gave the report as Marcia was absent. The Lent prayer walk initiative went well. It was discussed not to do the step counters next time but that congregational participation went well otherwise. We will continue to track prayer walk miles until the goal of making it to Jerusalem is reached. Spring Carnival went well. Over 75 people came in. The next Diaper Giveaway is May 7<sup>th</sup> from 4-6 pm. Rachel's Hope has not been told they need to relocate yet. Mission of the Month for May will be both the Salvation Army's One Roof Program and the Bishop's Miracle Offering and UMCOR. Pearl will put together a basket and sign to collect items at the back of the sanctuary. Lake Poinsette Day was May 10<sup>th</sup>. The 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders were invited to help. Walk a Mile went well. Thursday Night Live-hoping to have a booth. There is no children's night this year, so we are looking at picking a date. Also, we are looking at hosting our van in the July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade. Vacation Bible School will be the next mission of the month. Lori will work with the kids to organize that.

Sue L had gone to Ukraine update and our church was mentioned about the help they gave to the Ukrainian Family. Peggy reported that the families work visas will be up in July. They may be asking the communities to house these people as they will be losing their jobs and their homes. They may be relocated to other countries. But they will not be sent back to Ukraine.

Kris Mutzenberger, District Superintendent: One of the parts of the process is consultation with the church. Associate Pastor roles are training to be pastors. In order to fill the vacant position of the Associate Pastor, Kris is asking Watertown First Church if they would be willing to be in partnership with Clark. Whoever this pastor would be would be half time in Clark and half time in Watertown. The half time pastor would preach one weekend in Watertown and the rest of the time in Clark. They have a parsonage in Clark so the pastor would live in Clark. The cost would be split 50/50. She met with Clark and they are willing to try the partnership. The salary, utilities, retirement, would all be split 50/50.

Sue Luken moved to go into the partnership with Clark with the 50/50 sharing costs. Stephanie second the motion. All aye. Kris will go back to the Council and organize getting a Pastor into Clark and Watertown half time for both.

We are still looking for a member of our Leadership Team. Please think about coming forward and taking on the position.

Closed with the Breakthrough Prayer.

Next meeting June 10, at 5:00 p.m. Meeting adjourned at 7:24 p.m. Devotion will be given by whoever comes forward.

## **Staffing Updates!**

As we gather to say goodbye to Pastor Bryce and Meaghan this month, we get to celebrate all the ways their ministry here at First Church has strengthened our community. We celebrate all the ways that Bryce has poured into our youth. We celebrate his commitment to the whole church and to the call of Christ. We celebrate the ways that Meaghan has connected us all to the ministry of the Beacon Center. We celebrate and grieve as they go, knowing their ministry will continue to share Christ's love wherever they are.

Over the last few weeks, the Staff Parish Committee and Leadership Team been working together with the Dakotas Cabinet to find the best path forward at First Church. We are (as I type this) still working together to find a ½ time associate to be appointed here at First Church.

With the expectation of a ½ time associate pastor, the Staff Parish and I have been working to fill the remainder of the work and time that Pastor Bryce has dedicated to our community. And so, we are excited to share that Rev. Amy Atkins, a member of our congregation and Elder in the United Methodist Church is going to step into the role of Associate of Youth Ministries here at First Church.

Pastor Amy's pastoral ministry in Plankinton/White Lake UMCs, Ortonville/Big Stone City/Milbank Parkview UMCs and First UMC in Fargo included youth ministry work in the midst of her wider pastoral ministry. For the last 8 years, Pastor Amy stepped out of pastoral ministry to pursue another calling, supporting students and staff in schools through work in special education and behavior services. Pastor Amy has been working the last 3 years with the Southwest West Central Service Cooperative, as a consultant in school districts in Northeast South Dakota. In this role she collaborates with staff and parents to identify individual needs, build student skills and progress.

We are excited to bring Amy on board as a part of our pastoral team.

Some of you will remember Sandy Weidner-Middleton who worked in our nursery and helped run our Children's Ministry program. Sandy passed away on April 18, 2025.




